

CAMPUS SECURITY REPORT

Aveda Institute Las Vegas prepares this report to comply with the Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Crime Statistics Act. The report is prepared in cooperation with the local law enforcement agencies surrounding our campus.

Reporting Procedures

Should you need to report criminal actions or other emergencies occurring on campus, please report this directly to the Director of AVEDA INSTITUTE LAS VEGAS. If the Director is not available please report to the educator in charge. These officials will notify the local law enforcement agency or emergency medical technicians depending on the seriousness of the incident. We do not recognize any off-campus student organizations that would be covered by this act.

Timely Warnings

In the event that a situation arises, either on or off campus, that, in the judgment of the Director constitutes an ongoing or continuing threat, a campus wide "timely warning" will be issued. The Director will immediately notify the Institute community upon the confirmation of a significant emergency or dangerous situation involving an immediate threat to the health or safety of students or staff occurring at the Institute, unless issuing a notification will compromise efforts to contain the emergency. The warning will be issued through the most effective and efficient means available and may include instant messaging to students and Institute employees. Notices may also be posted in the common areas throughout the Institute.

Campus Security Authority and Jurisdiction

The purpose and authority of AVEDA INSTITUTE LAS VEGAS staff are limited to the enforcement of campus rules and regulations. Incidents that go beyond this scope are referred to and investigated by the Las Vegas Police Department. The Institute does not provide security guards on its campus premises. The ultimate authority for law enforcement at the Institute is the local police department. The Institute does not have any written agreements with local police departments for the investigation of alleged criminal offenses.

To insure accurate and prompt reporting of all crimes, AVEDA INSTITUTE LAS VEGAS will take full written statements from involved parties and witnesses on all emergency or criminal incidents. The written statements are included as part of the written report and such statements may be used by AVEDA INSTITUTE LAS VEGAS staff and local/state law enforcement authorities for the purpose of apprehension and/or crime prevention.

Drug & Alcohol Policy

The institution strictly prohibits the possession, use and sale of illegal drugs and strictly enforces Federal and State drug laws.

The institution has a drug abuse program in effect, as required under sections 1213 of the HE. For additional information on the institution's drug program please the Director.

School Access

The only people allowed in the school are AVEDA INSTITUTE LAS VEGAS staff, students and patrons. AVEDA INSTITUTE LAS VEGAS reserves the right to ask any visitor, student, staff or patron to leave the facility following any disruptive behavior. The institution opens its doors at 8:00 a.m. daily. The doors are locked at 5:00 p.m. Tuesday thru Saturday. Students and staff are advised to leave the building in a group and to be aware of the surroundings.

Security Awareness Programs

All new enrolled students participate in a general orientation class. During the orientation class, the need and procedure of reporting emergencies and criminal activities, campus security measures and crime prevention is discussed. Similar information is presented to new employees.

Sexual Misconduct Policies & Procedures

The Aveda Institute Chapel Hill is committed to providing a working and educational environment for all students, faculty and staff that is free from sex discrimination, including sexual misconduct. Every member of the School community should be aware that the Institute is strongly opposed to sexual misconduct, and that such behavior is prohibited by state and federal laws.

The Institute's Sexual Misconduct Policy describes the Institute's programs to prevent sexual misconduct, and the procedures that the Institute will follow once an incident of sexual misconduct has been reported. This Policy is disseminated widely to the Institute community through publications, the Institute website, new employee orientations, student orientations, and other appropriate channels of communication. The Institute provides training to key staff members to enable the Institute to handle any allegations of sexual misconduct promptly and effectively. The Institute will respond quickly to all reports of sexual harassment, and will take appropriate action to prevent, to correct, and if necessary, to discipline behavior that violates this policy.

The Institute's Sexual Misconduct Policy governs sexual misconduct involving students that occurs on any Institute property or in connection with any Institute-sponsored program or event. This Policy applies to all students, employees, and third parties conducting business with the Institute, regardless of the person's gender, gender identity, sexual orientation, age, race, nationality, class status, ability, religion or other protected status. The Institute encourages victims of sexual violence to talk to somebody about what happened – so victims can get the support they need, and so the Institute can respond appropriately. As further described in the Policy, the Institute will seek to respect a victim's request for confidentiality to the extent possible, while remaining ever mindful of the victim's well-being.

Sexual Offender Registration

In accordance to the Campus Sex Crimes Prevention Act of 2000, the Clery Act, and the Family Rights and Privacy Act of 1974, the Institute is providing information for where students and employees may obtain information regarding registered sex offenders. The Campus Sex Crimes Prevention Act requires institutions of higher education to provide a statement advising the campus community where law enforcement information provided by a state concerning registered sex offenders can be obtained.
